Healing Silks Introduces “Circle in Pink” to Support People Experiencing Emotional, Mental or Physical Trauma

Portland, Oregon, October 1, 2008, Diana Wesley and Abby Charden Mobasher, founders of Healing Silks, in conjunction with Cathy Chapman, Ph.D., mind-body psychotherapist, have introduced their Circle in Pink program to assist people struggling with trauma, grief and various medical issues.

Chapman, who developed the ceremony included in the Circle in Pink program, said, “When a woman hears of a friend or loved one in distress, her natural desire is to reach out and do something. Many times she doesn’t know what to do. Circle in Pink consists of a kit which includes ‘How to Form a Prayer Circle,’ a suggested format for the ceremony, a Book of Hope containing pre-printed poems, prayers and blessings as well as room to write personal messages, and silks from The Healing Silks Company.”

Wesley, designer of the silk scarves that come with the kit, said: “The scarves included with the Circle in Pink kit are designed with leading-edge scientific processes which help relieve stress and promote healing. In addition, anytime the one who is the center of the Circle in Pink wears or uses the silk, pleasant memories of the love and prayers included in the ceremony continue to be supportive.”

When people undergo trauma, be it from loss, accident or illness, they need support and comfort to keep their immune system strong. The Healing in Pink line consists of one scarf, *Pink Embrace*, specifically designed to give comfort and another, *Inner Warrior*, to promote inner strength and courage. The Healing in Pink line consists of 100% silk scarves, prayer shawls, and powerful affirmation bookmarks strengthened with encouraging words.

Available separately are the newest additions to the line: a selection of super soft scarves and hat liners for those undergoing chemotherapy. The fabric is from natural bamboo, and is cool in summer, warm in winter, and has none of the scratchiness of so many similar products.

The Circle in Pink can be formed by any group, be it a faith community, a collection of neighbors, family and friends, club members or a group of co-workers.
